Dear Representative Fetterman

I am disappointed I never received a response to our request for you to sponsor the *Florida Citizen's Employment Protection Act of 2010*.

Public and Private-Verify is currently being used in 12 States. Today, one in four new hires in America is checked using E-Verify. Three states, AZ, MS and SC mandate all licensed businesses use E-Verify. In AZ, with the law in place since early 2008, one third of all illegal aliens self-deported by this summer and crime is down in Phoenix by 25%. **With similar results in Florida, we could expect 330K illegal aliens to self-deport in the first 18 months with a tremendous reduction in educating, medicating and incarcerating costs that now amount to \$4 Billion a year.**

In Florida we have nearly 20,000 Patriotic businesses that voluntarily use E-Verify. Unfortunately we have a large number of businesses in Florida that put profits ahead of patriotism and openly violate the law by hiring illegal workers.

Illegal aliens work openly in Florida because state lawmakers allow it. Illegal alien hiring exists because state legislators no longer represent their constituents. Instead, they have chosen to represent the special interest groups in this state that openly violate the law.

In the past legislators have used the excuse their bill slots are full to not sponsor legislation. This reason is not acceptable to reject sponsoring this legislation. As you are aware, legislators can withdraw a bill and substitute more important legislation prior to the session starting.

In the past some legislators have said that this is a federal problem. Let me make one thing perfectly clear. It is the responsibility of every level of government to protect its citizens. The E-Verify program was enacted by Congress to help states protect the jobs of legal workers. Federal courts have repeatedly upheld a state's right to mandate E-verify for Public and Private Businesses.

At the end of the day, there are only two sides to this issue: ***You either support the hiring of illegal aliens or you support the hiring of your fellow citizens.***

We believe that the citizens of Florida have a right to know where their Representatives stand on this issue. We will be posting on our web site the survey and all letters to and from their legislators regarding the *Florida Citizen's Employment Protection Act of 2010*.

Included is a survey to fill out and return to our office. If you choose not to support this bill, there is a place for you to explain your position. Each and every state legislator knows how severe

and devastating our unemployment numbers are in Florida, so we will be expecting one Patriotic sponsor from the House and one Patriotic sponsor from the Senate. All other members should sign on as co-sponsors, without exception.

Every legislator should take a stand on this issue by returning this survey. No response will be regarded as a repudiation of oath of office to protect and defend American workers.

The lives of Floridians are at risk and ignoring them will have consequences.
